History Made By ROTC Cadet

Senior ROTC Cadet Justin Garrison recently participated in the National Youth Fitness Program test. It requires you to do sit-ups, pull-ups, push-ups, a 300 yard shuttle run and a standing long jump. To receive a perfect score you must do 100 sit ups in two minutes, 50 push ups in two minutes, 20 pull ups, the shuttle run in 46 seconds, and a 8 feet 5 inch long jump. Justin did 133 crunches in two minutes, 33 more than what is required to get a perfect score. He then did 61 push-ups, 11 more than the 50 you need to get a perfect score. After this, he did 22 pullups which is two more than what is need to get a perfect score. He did the shuttle run in 46 seconds, and the standing long jump coming in at 8 feet 5 inches and one quarter. This being said, Justin received a perfect score of 500, making him only the third person to do it in RULH Cadet history. Congrats Justin, on this significant feat!


As the fight in Iraq continues, the United States Military will be sending two more companies from the Army's 82nd Airborne Division into the fight against ISIS. There will be nearly 200 additional troops deployed to the Middle East. A U.S. Defense Official has said that more troops will be sent to Mosul—"to provide additional 'advise and assist' support to our Iraq Partners as they liberate Mosul,"

There have been rumors that there will be upwards of 1000 troops sent out to act as a reserve force. However, in a recent press briefing, the rumor has been denied. At the Townsend said that there will be no large number of troops being deployed because the efforts to combat ISIS are working. With the small addition of troops, the pentagon is optimistic that the fight in Mosul will be over within months and the fight with ISIS in general within a few years.

Some of the troops will be sent to Qayyarah Airfield West, we currently have gunships and rocket systems stationed here. The additional troops will be assisting in this ongoing battle over Iraq's second largest city. The United States Army is not alone in the battle, but rather, helping the Iraqi forces that are fighting to take down ISIS.

Iraq Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi said that together we are defeating them militarily. For example, last month, US assisted with the jet bombing on West Mosul. While nearly 200 civilians were killed, the fight in this city is coming to an end. WIth the new troops, this can be achieved faster. Which hopefully means, the war will end and they will not be kept overboard for long.







The Rise of PG-13

Formerly known as PG-24, this 26 year old from Palmdale, California is officially starting to earn the title of superstar. I am talking about Paul George, star Small forward from the Indiana Pacers. The Fresno State prospect was drafted 10th overall by the Indiana Pacers. He was originally ranked 251st in high school, proving he has been underrated for a while now. Paul George currently is a three time All-NBA Team Player and three time All-Defensive team Player.

He was a rising superstar during the 2012-2013 season, where he had his classic duel starting against Lebron James and the Miami Heat in the Eastern Conference Finals at the Playoffs. What ended up getting him more attention was the poster dunk he did in game two on Chris Anderson. The next season he showed his full arsenal by becoming an All Star Game starter and dual threat on offense and defense. Then he played in the playoffs again against the Miami Heat and Lebron James and once again, lost. During summer Paul George was trying out for the USA Fiba world cup basketball team on a nationally televised game when he broke his leg on a chasedown block attempt on James Harden. The leg injury could have been career ending. It caused him to miss almost the whole 2014-2015 season. However, he came back for the last six games where he averaged nine points in fifteen minutes per game.

Then in his big return season he started off averaging 19 points through the first few games, then offensively exploded. He had two 40 point games in that season. Those two games were 47 points (Career High) against the Utah Jazz and 44 points against the Oklahoma City Thunder. He was an All Star starter again in 2016 where he dropped 41 points, almost breaking the record for most points in the All star game; the record was 42 at that time. He did break the record for most 3's in an All Star Game with nine 3's. Paul George did make it to the playoffs, but lost in seven games to the Toronto Raptors in the first round. Paul George averaged a career high in points and rebounds that season.

Then the 2016-2017 season came and he started off slow, really slow. He began to pick up after the all star break, where he was a reserve on the all star team. The last few weeks he has been dominant, near the end of the regular season. Paul George's best game was against the Cavs in a double overtime thriller where Lebron dropped 40 and Paul George dropped 44 points. The last two weeks he is averaging 32 points a game. Paul George won Eastern conference player of the week; he has been great. As of now PG and the Pacers will be playing Lebron and the Cavs in the first round of the NBA Playoffs.







Abel Tesfaye, or as he is better known, The Weeknd, released his newest album, "Starboy", in November of 2016. It is his third studio album, and he has taken quite a turn from the norm for himself in this album. The Weeknd is known from his dark, low-profile sound, matched with vocals many compare to 'The King Of Pop' himself, Michael Jackson. The Weeknd has been known to talk about his rough upbringing in Toronto. He may have shied away from that in 'Starboy' slightly, as much of the music has a very positive melody to it.

In this album it has eighteen tracks, which may be the album's biggest downfall. Often times when we see an album exceed ten to twelve tracks you worry the sound may start to become diluted, or that the artist is relaying the same message over and over. The Weeknd was on the verge of becoming just this, but before this happens he cuts it off right in time. This being said, the rating I would have to give this album is a 8.5/10. I would have easily settled for four to six less tracks, as that would probably mean for a higher quality of focus on the rest. Some of my favorite tracks are 'Starboy', 'Reminder', 'Six Feet Under', 'Ordinary Life', and 'I feel It Coming'.







Harden Vol. 1 Review

James Harden is an NBA MVP candidate, and everyone loves his game and style. Since signing a two hundred million dollar contract over thirteen years with Adidas, he has taken on the role of being different. Harden, known also as 'The Beard' due to his giant beard, has shown that he thinks outside of the box both on and off the court. That does not change in his first signature shoe with adidas, the Harden Vol. 1.

Just recently I purchased the Harden Vol. 1, and I have really gotten to break it in and I really feel that I know how the shoe works, and what its weaker and stronger points are. First off is the traction, Adidas does not change the outside of the box mentality here, going with a very odd outsole. It almost looks as if it's a bunch of circles and diamonds on the outsole. It did get the job done for me, but I have played in better.

Next, is the cushioning department. This was my favorite aspect of the shoe, as Adidas used its famous cushioning known as 'Boost' (my personal favorite cushioning). It has very good plush impact protection when jumping, but also it has a nice responsiveness when making hard cuts. Lastly, we have the upper of the shoe, and this is where it can get tricky. The pair I own, "The Disruptor", features a Jacquard material with a suede patch over the toe. Adidas switches it up on every pair so be sure to look up the materials before buying a specific model. I found the setup I had to just be okay. It definitely needs breaking in but even after that the materials feel slightly stiff. The setup was great, but the materials could be slightly softer.

So to wrap it up, the harden Vol. 1 is a very solid shoe. It gets the job done and its cushion gives the price point of \$140, a fair price. With slightly softer materials and a more traditional traction pattern, you could be talking about a shoe for the decade. I will give the Harden Vol. 1 a 7.5/10 rating. This is certainly a good shoe, and you can likely find it at your local shoe outlet.
